




# Cancer Control Continuum

# Estimated Numbers of Cancer Survivors by State as of January 1, 2019




States estimates do not sum to US total due to rounding.




# Education and Training of Oncology and Non-Oncology Careforce

- \* Interprofessional/team-based care


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# Long-Term and Late Effects

# Recommendations

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## Robust oncology workforce

- Increase federal funding for research at the National Institutes of Health, National Institute of Nursing Research, National Cancer Institute and the National Institute on Minority Health Disparities.
- Integrate content in primary and secondary schools

## Certifications for specialists and non-specialists

- Interprofessional training

## Advocate for policies and systems that promote interprofessional education

- Ensure access to palliative care and appropriate pain management, as well as psychosocial services, including the passage of the Palliative Care and Hospice Education and Training Act (H.R. 647/S. 2080).
