


















SEER DOESN'T COUNT EVERYONE



SEER DOESN'T COUNT METASTATIC RECURRANCE

Neither SEER nor Medicare capture data on metastatic recurrence following an early stage cancer diagnosis

In the case of breast cancer, 6-10% of people are diagnosed with de novo metastatic breast cancer, and they **are** captured

But 25-30% of people with early stage breast cancer will be diagnosed with metastatic disease, sometimes decades later

How to capture metastatic recurrence often diagnosed by imaging rather than pathology?

How to link new metastatic recurrence to prior early stage diagnosis?

Do we need to capture treatments?

Death certificate deficiencies

CAN ICD-10 CODES HELP?

There are already codes for early stage and metastatic sites

C50.*** is code for breast cancer, with modifiers specifying female or male, right vs left breast, different sites in the breast

There are codes for secondary malignant neoplasm of different sites, eg c79.51, of bone; C78.7, of liver
