The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)



Established by the UN General Assembly in 1950, the UN Refugee Agency leads and coordinates international action for the worldwide protection of refugees and the resolution of refugee problems.







Who is a **Refugee**?

The Definition of a Refugee is based on the 1951 Convention, a refugee is any individual, who:

"owing to well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, is outside the country of his (or her) nationality and is unable or, owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself (or herself) of the protection of that country..."



Refugees or migrants?



Migrants: People who choose to leave

Refugees: People forced to flee



All Signatories to the 1951 Convention or the 1967 Protocol

are bound to uphold the principle of

NON-REFOULEMENT

States may not return a refugee to a country where his or her life or freedom would be threatened.

Refugee Convention Article 33



Who is an Internally Displaced Person (IDP)?

 Has been forced to flee his or her home for the same reason as a refugee, but...

 Remains in his or her own country and has not crossed an international border






Who is an Asylum Seeker?

 Someone who claims to be a refugee, but whose case has not yet been evaluated.







79.5 MILLION PEOPLE HAVE BEEN FORCED TO FLEE THEIR HOME

- 45.7 million internally displaced people
- 29.6 million refugees
- 4.2 million asylum seekers



Largest refugee and IDP groups by Country of Origin

Refugees:

- Syria: 6.6 million
- Venezuela: 3.7 million
- Afghanistan: 2.7million
- S. Sudan: 2.2 million
- Myanmar: 1.1 million

IDPs:

- Colombia: 7.9 million
- Syria: 6.2 million
- DRC: 5.0 million
- Yemen: 3.6 million
- Somalia: 2.6 million
- Afghanistan: 2.6 mill





- 80% of the world's displaced people are in countries affected by acute food insecurity and malnutrition
- 73% of displaced people are hosted in neighboring country. The 5 top hosting countries are
 - Turkey (3.6 million)
 - Colombia (1.8 million)
 - Pakistan (1.4 million)
 - Uganda (1.4 million)
 - Germany (1.1 million)




